Nicene Creed



First – a little of my story...

I was very blessed to have been born into a life with Christ. Baptized at birth, raised in a God-fearing southern Christian family; I was active in our church every week as crucifer, as a choir member, and occasionally reading the lessons. As soon as I as old enough to get an allowance, I began my own share of tithing. (I think initially it as only a penny, as my allowance as only a dime a week!) I was confirmed when I was 12 and, had there been more kids in our little Episcopal church, I'm sure I would have been an active leading participant in a youth group. Church camp every summer at Camp Henry was a family tradition that I carried on from 3rd grade and up, all the way through high school as a counselor. Although I didn't understand it at the time, my stewardship had been occurring all along, with sharing the talents God had given me.

I admit I went through a fairly long phase of not attending church...not so much rebelling against God – although I had my share of that – but mostly because the "church building" didn't meet my needs so to speak; the people didn't mean fellowship to me. With my strong upbringing in faith, I did continue a personal relationship with God, in what I saw as a more direct communication with Him.

Together Bill and I tried to find a church to go to, but never felt a connection, even to the church in North Raleigh we became members of, so our attendance was sporadic at best during our first 10 years or so together. When we moved to Sanford, we were a bit skeptical of "church". Being born and raised an Episcopalian, we considered St Thomas, but by this time I had lost faith in the "establishment" of religion; the inconsistency and go-with-the-flow approach I saw in the Episcopal denomination, but I didn't know where else to go, so again we became sporadic attendees at St Thomas.

When we became foster parents the first time, I knew the importance of being raised in a church family, so for her, we became more regular attendees. It was then that I realized my journey had found a landing zone. The more we came, the more I realized that Father Craig wasn't the typical Episcopal minister that I had lost faith in over the years. Through his ministering, as well of that of the congregation, I began to see that a church building and a "denomination" wasn't what it was about, and that he wasn't the type of spiritual leader who just walked the denominational line. His strength of conviction, that he often even put in writing, to stand firm in his beliefs of the way it should be, helped us find a home. And obviously, we weren't the only ones. Here, we found that fellowship – that church family that was real, not superficial.

That fellowship, that family, has been such a huge difference in our lives. We have been blessed with so much, and in SO many ways, in this life, sometimes it's easy to forget that it ALL comes from Him. The talents we have and use every day, the people who touch our lives and the lives of those we touch, it all comes from God; it's all part of God's plan.

n Colossians 3:23-24 Paul writes:

Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving.

A *steward* is someone who manages something of someone else's. Stewardship is about being grateful, responsible *stewards* of the gifts we receive from God. The tradition of giving back to God and to the church comes from the Biblical practice of "tithing," which means to give back a tenth of our earnings to God (Numbers 18:26). But "earnings" isn't just about money. We often hear that "time is priceless" – the time we spend helping others, sharing what we've learned, and taking the time to listen and learn what others have to share with us. It's about how God is calling people to use their gifts, passions, time and talents. Each week, putting that donation into the offering plate, I know I'm giving back what will lead to helping others find what God has blessed them with. Yes, it's money and it helps pay the bills, but it also reminds me of all the time and talents God has given to me to share, has given to all of those around us to share. That little sacrifice I'm making, reminds me of God's sacrifice of His Son, earning us a place in heaven. It reminds me of the biblical basics: "to be a responsible steward of God's gifts". It reminds me that I am a part of a church family, helping to support them, as they have given so freely of themselves to support me in more ways than I can express here in words. That's what Stewardship means to me...being part of God's family, serving by sharing all that God has blessed me with in this life.
